Tire Stewardship Manitoba's Community Demonstration Grant and Video

What is it?

One-time matching grants of up to \$20,000 are provided to Manitoba schools through the Tire Stewardship Manitoba (TSM) Community Demonstration Grant Program. Grants are available for the use of recycled tire products made from Manitoba tires in landscape, flooring, pathway, athletic track, playground and other projects.

Why should our school do a demonstration project?

Demonstration projects like this instill values and principles of reduce, reuse, recycle, repurpose, and rethink. These education for sustainable development topics are curriculum-linked. Actively engaging youth in community demonstration projects like this help them understand how to live sustainably and become effective stewards of our environment for the benefit of present and future generations.

When and how can I apply?

Applications are accepted year round and approved quarterly in March, June, September and December.
